- **Utilize** the health care system properly.
- Be responsible for **your health** and follow the instructions properly.
- **Prevent** the spread of the disease.
- Meeting the **financial** commitments.
- Follow the **rules and regulations** of the institution.
- Accept the **results.** {do not insult the provider }

CONFLICT BETWEEN PRINCIPLES

- Use Code of conduct as a **reference point**.
- Not every **challenge or situation** you face is mentioned in the code.
- Codes are used as a reference, when we are in **ethical dilemma**.
- **Fiduciary responsibility** to the patient and hospital are often contradictory.
example: Neck pain-recommending unnecessary tests and investigations
